As we enter a new year, we are looking forward to the bounty that spring and summer will bring. The seed ordering and garden planning is officially in full-swing. We still have plenty of squash, onions, and garlic stocked thanks to the amazing Garden crew. We were excited to sell our veggies at the Glenora Farm Christmas Fair, which was a massive success!

The Farm workshop has been very busy over the last few months. We have six new muscovy ducks who will keep our resident muscovy, Chive, in good company. He is very happy to have some friends again! Our new chickens that we got in June are laying through the winter. In December 2023, our chickens were producing an average of 37 eggs per day.

That's 98 dozen per month! The houses have been enjoying fresh eggs, and we have been selling and donating some. The chickens have brought many new workshop tasks which are keeping everyone busy.

This year, we are excited to be offering Backyard Chickens 101 workshops for our community members, friends, and family.
